

Printing them on white cardstock works best so the red, yellow and green (removable) stickers show up. In addition, laminating the cards enables one to use them multiple times and allow workshop participants to write their “success stories/strategies” on them with wet-erase (i.e., Vis-à-vis) markers.

3. Evaluations are conducted on a regular basis

5. Project successes are made known to the community

6. Project successes are made known to funders

DEMONSTRATED PROGRAM IMPACT

7. Public relations (marketing) strategies are in place

FUNDING

1. Current funding is sufficient for project operations

FUNDING

2. Funding is available on a long term basis (at least 2 more years)

FUNDING

3. There are plans in place for obtaining additional funding

FUNDING

4. There is a person responsible for grant proposal writing

FUNDING

5. There is adequate funding for hiring and retaining quality staff

PROJECT STAFFING

1. Staff is involved in program design

PROJECT STAFFING

2. Staff is involved in program evaluation

PROJECT STAFFING

3. Staff is involved in project decision making

PROJECT STAFFING

4. Staff turnover is low

PROJECT STAFFING

5. Staff is committed to the project's mission, vision , and goals

PROJECT STAFFING

6. Staff is qualified to work on the project

PROJECT STAFFING

7. Staff is flexible and creative

PROJECT STAFFING

8. Staff are recognized and rewarded for their work

9. Staff is adequately trained

10. Staff is from the community that the project serves

1. Programs are eliminated when they do not meet community needs
